Mindfulness Summary & Ongoing Practice

Below is the summary of the final 8 mindful lessons this winter. The goal of mindfulness helps us to increase our "thoughtfulness" as we interact with family, friends, and others at home and in the community.

Mindfulness helps each of us to create a greater awareness- and thoughtful space- before we we act/react to everyday life experiences. It helps us to develop more understanding, grace, resiliency, and kindness for ourselves and others.

- Heartfulness Kindness and Caring on the Playground. Role play and talk about playground situations in which we might show increased compassion on our
- 10. **Emotions** Name all of the emotions we have and be mindful of how they change how your body feels. By taking a moment to name the emotions, we can develop space in how we choose to react to that emotional experience.
- 11. **Mindful Movement** As we go throughout everyday experiences, think and pay attention to the movements of your body, both fast and slow. We often ignore our amazing body. As you work and play, pay attention to your muscles, movement, and touch.
- 12. **Gratitute: Looking for the Good** Notice the things that bring us joy. Write down these things for which you are grateful. Make a list each day, for an entire week, about these things. Talk about them as a family, maybe at dinner time.
- 13. Mindful Walking Practice mindfulness when you are walking places. You're your toes to your waist, notice your body movements, and the sensations in your feet, legs, and body while you walk. Notice how they all work together to get you
- 14. Mindful Eating Use all of your 5 senses when you eat. Take time to appreciate what you eat, as you smell, taste, and eat. Eat a bit slower one day, to just take time to enjoy it. Where did it come from? How does it taste? Describe the texture and taste. Talk about favorite foods and different types of foods.
- 15. Mindful Test Taking At school and in life we often have tests, job interviews, or important meetings. How do I feel when these times are coming up? Will a moment to do a body scan help me to discover how my body feels at times like this? If I am feeling worried, what helps me to become prepared and calm? Learn to use mindful breathing or other strategies to calm myself, if needed.
- **16.** Mindfulness Wrap-Up Our final lesson was to review and talk about everything we have learned so far in the year. We also reviewed favorite times and places where we each like to practice mindfulness at home and school. Make mindfulness (breathing, feeling, hearing, seeing, walking, eating) and heartfulness/ gratitude part of your daily life, everywhere you go.
